What is All Saints Day? (cont'd) The feast was originally on the date of the Pantheon's dedication, May 13, 609, and the date of an already existing feast in the East. It was later moved to its current date on the Roman calendar, where it is followed by the Commemoration of All Souls, that is, those righteous dead being purified in Purgatory.

All Saints Day is a special feast day on which Catholics celebrate all the saints, known and unknown. While most saints have a particular feast day on the Catholic calendar (usually, though not always, the date of their death), not all of those feast days are observed. And saints who have not been canonized — those who are in Heaven, but whose sainthood is known only to God — have no particular feast day.

Later, in the mid-eighth century, Pope Gregory III made the Feast of All Saints a holy day and fixed November 1 as the date for the celebration.
